Also, in conjunction with the MN Medal of Honor Memorial, there will be information on our nation's Medal of Honor recipients and their legacy of youth character development education that makes the generational connection to the selfless and courageous actions of those honored at the 2nd Annual Minnesota Heroes Day event. On that day there will also be 45- minute tours of the magnificently restored Capitol building ending on the steps of the Capitol and just a short walk down the Mall walkway to the memorials dedicated to our fellow Minnesota honorees.

There is no charge and free parking in Capitol parking lots convenient to the Capitol grounds. At the various memorials there will be water for attendees as well as free signed prints of the Minnesota Medal of Honor Memorial.
